- 4) B.Sc (Biostatistics): Revision was done according to CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) and presented. External BoS member suggested to have both formative and summative assessment if CBCS was followed. He also suggested that integrated 5 years course of Biostatistics (B.Sc + M.Sc Biostatistics can be started for students joining the course after

- Salient features of the changed the curriculum are as follows-
 - A. Postgraduate students shall maintain dynamic E-Logbook which need to be updated on weekly basis.
 - **B.** Postgraduate students will have to present one of the following to make him/her eligible to appear final examination.
 - a. Poster Presentation at a National/Zonal / State conference
 - b. Podium presentation at a National/Zonal / State conference
 - c. Have one research paper published / accepted as first author
- C. The postgraduate students shall essentially be required to participate in the teaching and training program of undergraduate students and interns.
- D. The students are excepted to complete in the first year
 - a. Course in research methodology
 - b. Course in Ethics
 - c. Course in ACLS and BCLS
- E. Changes in examination
 - a. The college will conduct formative assessment and university will conduct summative assessment.
 - b. Both formative and summative shall consist of theory and clinical or practical and Viva-voce.
 - c. Theory the theory exam, both formative and summative may be of descriptive answer of a question type, multiple choice, question type or mix of both types. The theory examination for the summative examination shall be of four theory papers. The first and the fourth paper shall be on basic medical sciences and recent advances, respectively.

Feedback analysis of the BPT Curriculum	for BPT program for the batch 2019 -2022
• The chairperson presented a detailed analysis of feedback on the curriculum from all stakeholders. 90-95% of respondents voted in favor of the curriculum. However, suggestions received by the professionals, alumni, and students were discussed. A few suggestions included: Having more exercise therapy classes than electrotherapy; considering evidence and clinical practice scenarios as applicable globally; having different T-L methods other than chalk and board • Members appreciated the feedback analysis process adopted by the institute and suggests to work on recommendation of stakeholders. They suggests to encourage students to use electrotherapy in clinical practice and consider basic and applied research in electrotherapy as that is lacking in India. The teaching methods should highlight evidences on effectiveness of electrotherapy in clinical conditions. They also discussed that what practice or evidence is applicable in India may not be applicable in other countries.	successfully attained by the students of batch 2019-22. The Dean presented the report and it was observed that the PO5 and PO6 attainments were borderline.
